Report Highlights

- April 2017 shows that all ARC agencies have screened children for ARC
- Twenty-six (26) children have started ARC to date, and out of these seven (7) started in April 2017. This is a 34% decrease for ARC registration compared to last month.
- Starting this month the number of children active in ARC will be reported for each month. This means that if a child has at least one visit during the reported month, they will be indicated as “active in ARC.” Out of total children in ARC (26) twenty (20) are currently active.
- The majority of the children (22) fall into the 3—6 years old age range, with one (1) child under 2 years of age and three (3) children over the age of 7.
- The number of visits to date have significantly increased since the last two months. In February, there were fifteen (15) number of visits; March saw 52 and April has jumped to 124, number of visits. This is a 42% percent increase since last month.
- Due to the increasing number of visits, this month we are able to see the rate of “No Shows” per agency. Based on the total number of visits and the total number of no shows for all agencies, ARC averages to 19% percent “No Show.”
- *Clifford Beers Clinic* has the highest rate of no-shows at 100% percent, reflecting two (2) “No shows” for two (2) visits. *Community Child Guidance Clinic* has the lowest rates at 0% percent no-shows.
- Last month more than half of the children in ARC were DCF committed. This month 38% percent of all children are DCF committed.
- Two agencies have no DCF committed children, *Charlotte Hungerford Hospital* and *Clifford Beers Clinic*.
- April 2017 indicates one (1) discharge. Last month’s report indicated two (2) discharges, but this was an error; consequently, we cannot yet determine an ARC discharge success rate.
