

Connecticut MATCH-ADTC Clinician Certification Criteria

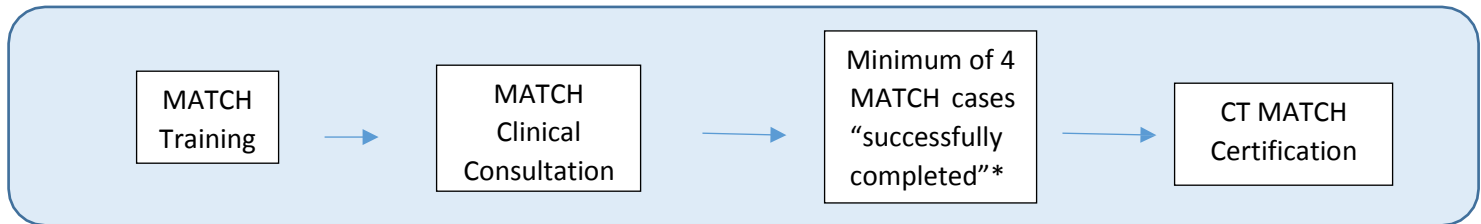
The Child Health and Development Institute, along with the Department of Children and Families and Harvard University, has developed a MATCH-ADTC clinician certification process to distinguish Connecticut clinicians who have successfully completed MATCH training and implementation requirements.

Eligibility

Clinicians and/or clinical supervisors who have participated in MATCH-ADTC clinical training, including those participating in a Learning Collaborative¹.

Process

The Child Health and Development Institute will administer Connecticut clinician certifications in MATCH-ADTC in collaboration with Harvard University. Case completion data collected in EBP Tracker will be analyzed biannually, for the terms: January – June and July – December, for active clinicians who have successfully completed training and clinical consultation requirements.



Criteria

Case Completion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 4 cases "successfully completed"* Defined as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Clinician indicates successful completion at discharge ○ Clinician demonstrates the use of at least 2 of 4 protocols (ADTC) ○ All baseline and at least one follow-up assessment series completed ○ Partial or full improvement documented on at least one report (Client or Caregiver) of Ohio Problem Severity, Functioning Subscale or Child PTSD Symptom Scale indicated by the Reliable Change Index
