

#### **Quality Improvement**

Promoting effective and equitable behavioral health services through data analysis, reporting, technical assistance, and other quality improvement support

CHDI leads quality improvement for Connecticut's youth crisis system and network of 22 outpatient psychiatric clinics for children (OPCCs).
