After School Services Clinical Support for Youth (Grades 8-12)	Up to 5 hour/day; 30 hour/week Youth has a diagnosed behavioral health need and behaviors that impede ability to function in a traditional after school setting Must have an RRG consultation Includes a minimum of 45 minutes of educational support for homework Can be used for before and after school care SOOT Transportation can be used for this service.	\$295 for up to 30 hours/week \$450/week for vacation weeks
Assessment Services	Assessment is requested when there is a concern that a child or youth has a mental health and/or a substance abuse issue that may require treatment Purpose of this assessment is to determine the child's or youth's strengths and limitations, functional capacity, needs and/or disabilities; to develop a differential diagnosis; to identify natural supports; and to develop or review an individualized service plan Assessment includes an initial face-to-face screening; observation of the child or youth; and collateral information and interviews 2 to 6 hours to a maximum of 12 hours, unless approved by a Program Director or above	Area Office negotiates rate based on type and intensity of evaluation needed

Assessment for Domestic Violence		
	<p>Assessment: Perpetrator of Domestic Violence is an assessment of an adult member of a current active DCF case.</p> <p>Purpose of the Assessment is to articulate the presence of risk factors, to make treatment recommendations and to develop appropriate and timely interventions to assure the safety and well being of all family members</p> <p>2 to 6 hours face to face, unless approved by a Program Director or above</p>	\$112 per hour
CHAP Case Management		
	<p>CHAP (Community Housing Assistance Program) Case Management is a community-based program</p> <p>For DCF committed youth living in a CHAP program and services are approved by the DCF CHAP Liaison</p> <p>Provide an average of five hours of dedicated service per week, per youth. Two hours shall consist of collateral contacts and at least three hours will be face-to-face contact</p> <p>A youth involved in CHAP or CHEER may receive Case Management</p> <p>Services as long as they remain in good standing with the DCF Policy requirements and their</p>	\$47 per hour or \$34 per diem based on five(5) hours per week
Community Based Life Skills		
	<p>Service is up to 120 hours within a 6-month period</p> <p>Service youth 14 and up residing in kin and core foster homes</p> <p>WAF can be created to cover the full 6 months</p> <p>WAF needed for any service hours exceeding 120 in 6 month period</p>	\$56/hour
Supervised Visitation		
	<p>Prior to securing SV, Contracted visitation services have been explored and inability to utilize SWCA must be verified</p> <p>Parenting education is NOT included in this service</p> <p>Parent coaching (interactional feedback) IS included in this service</p> <p>Transportation is included in the service and reimbursement begins when the client is present</p> <p>Assessment for the continuation of need should occur prior to extending the WAF quarterly</p> <p>Providers CANNOT accept a referral and refuse to provide transportation</p>	\$55/ hour; Face to face time with child/youth only; Documentation with invoice;
Support Staff		
	<p>Up to 8 hours/week up to 6 months</p> <p>For youth ages 8 - 21</p> <p>No diagnosis required</p> <p>Service is NOT mentoring and must have defined plan for natural supports at discharge</p> <p>Rate includes all activity type fees, there is not additional funding for meals or activities</p>	\$39/hour; Face to face time with child/youth only Documentation with invoice
Temporary Care		

	<p>Temporary care should be used as a time limited service while a more sustainable plan for care is developed</p> <p>Examples of appropriate use of temporary care include but aren't limited to;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When a child/youth is on a school suspension • When a child/youth is removed on an emergency basis • Other scenarios will be reviewed on a case by case basis <p>TC Is NOT used for daycare or school vacation</p> <p>Temporary Care Services is short-term and can be provided from one to several hours based on the individual need of the child or youth. Services will not be provided during overnight hours.</p> <p>Total of 70 hours or 90 days, whichever comes first.</p> <p>Rate does not include activity fees or meals</p>	<p>\$27/hour not to exceed \$200 per day</p> <p>\$27 per hour</p> <p>Approved group activities or sibling groups will be paid at \$27.00 per hour plus for first child and an additional \$13.50 per hour per additional child</p>
Therapeutic Support Services	<p>Child/youth between ages of 5-17 who have current behavior health diagnosis with active concerning behaviors</p> <p>RRG Consult IS REQUIRED to access this service and must be documented in narrative to include the goals of the service specific to the child referred</p> <p>Goals should be noted on the WAF for approval</p> <p>CANNOT exceed the 8 hours/weekly for 26 weeks; (6 months)</p> <p>Service is NOT mentoring and must have defined plan for natural supports at discharge</p> <p>Transportation is included in the hourly rate of \$45.00 (*Please note any transport exceeding 20 miles before pick-up will be reimbursed at the going rate. Once child is picked up the hourly rate starts)</p> <p>Rate includes all activity type fees, there is not additional funding for meals or activities</p>	<p>\$45/hour; Face to face time with child/youth only;</p> <p>Documentation must accompany the monthly invoice.</p>
Transportation General Livery	<p>General Livery provides general transportation for children and youth (not including school transportation)</p> <p>Children under 5 years old ARE NOT eligible for this service</p> <p>Cannot be used for children who meet criteria for school of origin transportation.</p>	<p>1 Child = \$55/Hr</p> <p>2 Children = \$80/Hr</p> <p>3 Children = \$100/Hr</p> <p>4+Children = \$120/Hr</p>
